However, many of us do not have access to these expensive tools. So, let's find out how to follow the money for free using CNN Business. While this is not going to produce an exhaustive list of investors and Wall Street firms, it is a great start!

Follow our step by step guide to find some of the big bucks behind the **top publicly traded**, **fossil fuel corporations**. The list below is a checklist you can use to quickly move through the research. There is also a step by step guide, using Exxon Mobil so that you can follow along as you dig!

HOW TO FIND THE CASH BEHIND THE FOSSIL FUEL INDUSTRY Checklist


- > Step 1: Go to CNN BUSINESS (https://www.cnn.com/business)
- > **Step 2:** Scroll down and on your right find the quote search bar.
- > **Step 3:** Using the stock symbol, search for the corporation you are looking for.

 Note: The stock symbol is the abbreviation for the company used in trading on the stock market.
- > **Step 4:** Click on the shareholders tab.
- > **Step 5:** Once you are at the shareholders tab, click on the Institutional Ownership option.
 - Once you are in this option, CNN Business provides you with a list of institutional investors (stockholders, mutual fund holdings and most recent institutional activity).

HOW TO FIND THE CASH BEHIND THE FOSSIL FUEL INDUSTRY with Exxon Mobil


Tip: It is useful to know which fossil fuel corporation you want to research and their stock symbol before you get started. A quick google search will reveal the stock symbol.

- » Step 1: Go to CNN BUSINESS (https://www.cnn.com/business)
- » Step 2: Scroll down and on your right find the quote search bar.



» **Step 3:** Using the stock symbol, search for the corporation you are looking for. Because we are looking for Exxon Mobil, we will enter **XOM** and click the name of the corporation when it pops up.

Tip: If the name of the corporation doesn't pop up, try searching with the stock symbol or the abbreviation the company uses when trading on the stock market.



This will take you to the summary page for the corporation.



» Step 4: Click on the Shareholders Tap.



Step 5: Once you are at the shareholders tab, click on the Institutional Ownership option (highlighted in blue below)



Once you are in this option, CNN Business provides you a list of institutional investors (stockholders, mutual fund holdings and most recent institutional activity).
